Let us know your interests! We will forward your inquiry to the current committee chair or group leader. Below is a list of activities, interest groups or projects in which you could become involved. If you don't find what you're looking for, create it! We are always interested in new ideas.

Committees and Projects (Check those that interest you. The committee chair will contact you)

- Book Sale (annual fund raiser, a six person committee with diverse responsibilities. great fun!)
- Activities and Programs (committee plans member programs and events, speakers, excursions, activities)
- Education Foundation (funding graduate level education at the national level through a branch fellowship)
- Great Explorations - (bi-annual conference, in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math for 5th-8th grade girls)
- Kitchen Tour (annual fund raiser, an 11 person committee with places for a wide variety of skills and interests)
- Scholarships (give away college scholarships, acknowledge local high school girls chosen for excellence in STEM)
- Membership (new members event, Membership Directory)
- Public Policy (advise branch of AAUW National Actions/Policy)
- Publicity/Communications (keep the branch in the local media through advertising and press releases, create advertising/newsletter, contact membership as needed)

Interest Groups (Check those that interest you. The group co-ordinator will contact you)

- Evening Bridge: Join other local Branch members for regular play.
- Afternoon Bridge: We meet on Wednesday afternoons usually 1:00 pm to 3:30. We take turns hosting in our homes. We try to play twice a month.
- Gardening Interest Group (GIG):
Share your interest! Learn from those with a greener thumb! Visit local nurseries and gardens! Participants trade books, knowledge and "starts"!
- Evening Book Group:
This group meets at 7:30 p.m. on the third Thursday of each month in members' homes. A schedule of books is available. Members sign up to lead the discussion, share reviews and provide wine! This group has been meeting consistently since 1984. New members are always welcome!
- Lunch Bunch Book Group:
This group sets a monthly schedule of books to read and a participant to lead the discussion. We meet 12:30-1:30 on the second Thursday of the month, Whitman College Campus. Books vary from non-fiction to current fiction, classics, local authors and current events. All members and guests are welcome on a regular or occasional basis.
- Dining Group:
Group members gather once a month (currently in the group), each preparing part of the hostess-planned meal, for fun and fabulous food! Themes for the meals are chosen in advance, members rotate among different homes each month (each member hosts one dinner). Singles, spouses/partners are welcome! Only 10 people at each dinner, so you'll meet lots of new friends in this interest group....and gather lots of fabulous recipes. October through March with a summer potluck planning meeting in August.
- Knitting Interest Group
Not a knitting class, just a reason to get together and knit, share patterns, projects, etc. We may add an evening meeting for those who want to get together more often and/or want an evening option. Anyone is welcome.
- Downhill Skiing Group: A seasonal group who meet and ski Bluewood on a varied schedule. We usually carpool.
